Dear Trail Club President,

The Terrapin Ski Club wishes to extend to the Terrapin Trail Club a challenge to participate in the honorable competition of imbibition. The conditions of the challenge are as follows:

- 1) Delegates from both clubs shall meet to decide:
  - a) Time and place of combat.
  - b) The number of representatives from each club which shall constitute a team.
- 2) The number of members of the "fair" sex on each team must be equal.
- 3) The executives of each club shall hand-pick the teams from their respective clubs.
- 4) A person who is a member of both clubs, if he is chosen by both clubs, shall choose which club they wish to represent.
- 5) At the appointed time and place, both teams shall meet to engage in combat.
- 6) There will be periodic sobriety tests which will consist of balancing a salt shaker on edge within 15 seconds after the salt shaker is picked up or touched by the person to be tested. There shall be salt on the table at the beginning of the test.
- 7) The contest shall be scored as follows:
  - a) The scoring judges shall be one person from each club who will not be members of the teams and who shall be responsible for driving the teams back to the university.
  - b) There will be no points scored for imbibing beverages other than beer.
  - c) Each team shall receive five (5) points for each large draught or thirty-five ~~¢~~ (35) points for each pitcher consumed by its members. (both teams must be drinking by the same increments, i.e. either glasses or pitchers.
  - d) Ten (10) points shall be awarded the team who has the individual member with the highest consumption for the entire contest.

- e) Four (4) points shall be awarded each team each time a member passes the sobriety test.
  - f) Two (2) points shall be subtracted from the score of each team each time a member retires to the "lounge".
  - g) the contest shall have a duration of not less than two hours or more than four hours.
- 8) The contest shall be won by the team with the most points.

The Terrapin Ski Club further proposes that this event be awarded the status of an bi-annual competition, and that the losing club this year invest in a plaque upon which can be inscribed the name of the winning club each year.

This challenged is respectfully submitted by the Executive Council of the Terrapin Ski Club.
